
BROADWAY UP CLOSE?

100 years ago, Tim felt compelled to start walking tours of the Broadway Theatre District further detailing and sharing those ghost stories, anecdotes, and wonderful tales of building a Broadway show from rehearsals

to opening night. Each licensed tour guide on our Green Team is a professional actor or stage manager who will also share personal stories from their careers in New York City and beyond.

MEETING LOCATION: Outside the Nederlander Theatre, 41st St. betw. 7th and 8th Aves.

Journey back in time with our Green Team Guides to Broadway's early years full of roof garden theaters, tap shoes, and theatrical con artists. Learn the true difference between a Broadway theater and an Off-Broadway theater and revel in the secrets hidden in plain sight in some of Broadway's most famous theaters. Tour-goers will hear how a show is created

from the first rehearsal to opening night and all of the craziness in between. And, of course, we'll explore the spirits that may still be lurking in the shadows backstage with a few unbelievable ghost stories. Utilizing iPads chock full of rarely seen photographs and videos from years of research, tour-goers will see Broadway's past and present merge before their eyes.

HIPPIES, DISCOS, & DOGS, OH MY!

MEETING LOCATION: Outside Studio 54 Theatre, 54th Street betw. B'way and 8th Ave.

The beautiful theaters at the northern end of the Theatre District remain nearly identical to the days when they were first built. As tour-goers weave among these original facades on the sidewalks north of Times Square, they will hear how Broadway transformed with the first million dollar show and the introduction of rock musicals. They'll also learn how a dog named Sandy would change one Tony

Award winner's life - and Broadway's canine future - while little orphan Annie belted "Tomorrow" in front of thousands. And with some of Broadway's longest running shows, from Hair! to Wicked, housed within these blocks, our Green Team Guides will bring to light the backstage quirks and secrets that are rarely heard.

THE HAMILTOUR

MEETING LOCATION: Coenties Alley outside of 85 Broad Street, Lower Manhattan

Are you as obsessed with Hamilton: An American Musical as we are? For the first time ever, tourgoers can join our Green Team Guides on Alexander Hamilton's sidewalks and explore "the revolution happening in New York" in the 1700s on our HamilTour. In addition to seeing the historical sites from the musical, guests will hear never-before-

heard stories and secrets from the creation of the record-breaking musical. Culminating gravesite of Alexander and Eliza Hamilton, tour-goers are sure to walk away even more obsessed with Hamilton: An American Musical than ever before! SHUBERT BROTHERS & BEYOND

MEETING LOCATION: Outside the Lyceum Theatre on 45th Street betw. 6th and 7th Aves.

As Times Square transformed from an area full of manure and horse stables to one of the busiest tourist destinations in the world, a battle for Broadway was brewing between a group of theatrical titans and three scrappy brothers with the last name of Shubert. Set against the backdrop of Broadway's most famous theaters, tour-goers will hear about the Shubert Brothers who monopolized Broadway

against all odds with the help of an awkwardly named architect. Add in the true origins of the Tony Awards and rarely heard stories from famous musicals ranging from Oklahoma! to Hamilton and we promise you'll walk away with a new appreciation for just how far Broadway has come




THE GHOSTLIGHT TOUR

MEETING LOCATION: In front of 1411 Broadway, south of 40th

Every night when the thousands of audience members leave the 41 Broadway theaters, a nightly ritual takes place unseen by most: the setting of the ghostlight. Join our Green Team Guides as we explore this, and other superstitions rooted in days gone by, but still held by theatre folk everywhere. Set against the backdrop of the ghostlight superstition, our guides will share stories of spirits that still lurk in the shadows backstage. We've

unearthed some truly spooky sightings: acrobats, costume designers, playwrights, actors, and even a priest! Utilizing iPads chock full of rarely seen photographs, news clippings and videos from years of research, tour-goers will see how the haunted of Broadway's present brings Broadway's past back to life!



MEETING LOCATION: Outside of the Good Morning, America windows at 44th Street & B'way

Journey back in time with our Green Team Guides to 1903 as guests get a rare behind-the-scenes look at Broadway's oldest theater: The Hudson. This interior tour offers tour-goers an exclusive view of the nooks and crannies of this historic building that was restored in 2017 to its original glory after decades of narrowly avoiding demolition. For over 100 years the theater's walls have witnessed tragedy, gangsters, and legends of non culture music

and legends of pop culture, music, and Broadway who created iconic moments amid the glow of Louis Comfort Tiffany's original lighting. For 90 minutes guests will bask in these stories told in the theatrical silence of an empty Broadway theater - a rare, oneof-a-kind experience to peek behind the curtain on Broadway!
